Do You Want to Vote at the 2013 AAUP Annual Conference? Read This.

Each meeting has a different certification form and different rules for credentialing delegates. Please notice the deadlines to complete each form (different for each one).

You may still register until 6:00pm on Friday, June 14.

Proportional Voting:

A proportional vote is a special kind of vote permitted in the AAUP Annual Meeting that allows credentialed delegates to the Annual Meeting (that is, delegates who have obtained credentials by using the above two forms) to cast votes proportional to the number of active members they represent. Also, any active members present who are not certified as delegates and not otherwise represented by a chapter delegate may vote in a proportional vote, but those members may only cast a single vote. Remember: all delegates must be registered for the Annual Conference and certified as a delegate (chapter or conference) by 6:00pm on Friday, June 14, 2013 (as noted above). You may not be credentialed as a delegate from the floor of the AAUP Annual Meeting.
