PREVENTATIVE

- **GENERAL TIPS:**
 - Do not use your institutional accounts for anything sensitive, such as organizing work.
 - If you use Zoom, Google, etc., ensure they are not tied to your institutional accounts or devices.
 - Keep your software up to date.
 - Use a password manager, strong randomized passwords, and two-factor identification.
