J. A graduate of Johns Hopkins University with a BA in Political Science, Mr. Morrow was, the Director of the Md AFL-CIO's youth program, Frontlash, and was an organizer for Council 67 AFSCME.

Recently served as chief shop steward for the staff union at AFGE and Executive Board Member of Local 2 OPEIU and a Delegate to the Baltimore and DC AFL-CIO Labor Councils. Elected twice to the Md State Democratic Central Committee, twice been the Democratic nominee for the Md legislature. Member of the bars of Md, the U.S. District Court for Maryland, the U.S. Fourth Circuit, and the Supreme Court, as well as the AFL-CIO Lawyers Committee.
